The School

Founded in 1957, Dunn School is an independent, college preparatory, 6th through 12th grade coeducational boarding and day school. We are located in the heart of the Santa Ynez Valley, in Los Olivos, California, 30 miles from Santa Barbara. The mission of the Dunn School community is to educate the whole student to his or her fullest potential in preparation for a life of learning and responsible leadership in society. To accomplish our mission, we as students, teachers, staff, parents, trustees, and friends are committed to understanding and living by the following core values: **academic excellence**, **emotional wellness, physical readiness, social responsibility and moral courage**.

Curriculum and Programs

Life of Learning: Dunn's curiculum inspires students toward a life of learning. All students participate in a broad program of challenging academics, athletics, arts, outdoor experiences, leadership, and community service. Because class sizes are small, students engage actively in discussion, debate and group work. Dunn's intimate size facilitates student-teacher dialogue outside the boundaries of the classroom. AP and Honors sections are offered to qualified students. Dunn offers diverse electives in addition to a rigorous core academic foundation.

Leadership: The Leadership Program at Dunn prepares students for ethical leadership in a complex society. The program includes a residential values curriculum, an outdoor education program, a community service program, a leadership speaker series, domestic and international travel experiences, and a host of leadership roles available to the student body ranging from Prefect to initiating a new activity or club. The program encourages students to raise their self awareness, foster social responsibility, and develop their moral courage.

Athletics and Physical Readiness: All students participate on at least one interscholastic team during the course of the year. Students may choose to participate in other alternative activities for one of the three athletic seasons. Drama, rock climbing and mountain biking, community service, yoga, dance, and horseback riding are among additional possibilities. Athletic teams emphasize development of skills, teamwork and sportsmanship.

The Faculty

Dunn School has 40 faculty members and the student/faculty ratio is 6:1. The average class size is 10. Faculty members serve as academic advisors to a small group of students, and also provide inspiration as mentors, coaches, and residential community members.

Dunn's faculty is both highly credentialed and passionate about teaching students. Sixty-eight percent of faculty and administrators hold at least one graduate degree. Dunn teachers are instructional experts, and they also bring fascinating real-world experience to their classrooms.

Graduation Requirements

Students must take five or six classes each semester. In addition to the required diploma standards, students supplement their program with a variety of electives. Dunn School grades on a two-semester calendar totaling 34 weeks and grades are issued twice a year.
