Saint John's Prep (SJP) shares the facilities and campuses of both Saint John's University and the College of Saint Benedict; two of the top-rated Catholic liberal arts colleges in the United States.

- Each semester, approximately 20 SJP students take at least one college class at CSB/SJU and receive college credit for the courses.
- Six of our SJP classes receive college credit from CSB/SJU. These classes are Spanish and German levels IV, V/IB, Pre-Calculus and Advanced English 12/IB English. Students receive SJP high school credit and CSB/SJU college credit for these classes.

FACILITIES, EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS, PERFORMING ARTS:

All students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities while at Saint John's Prep. Participation in either an athletic or non-athletic extracurricular activity enhances a student's high school experience. Recreational facilities include: fitness center, swimming pools, basketball/volleyball courts, racquetball courts, indoor climbing wall, indoor track and indoor/outdoor tennis courts. The performing arts include band, choir, string ensemble, jazz band and individual instruction in these areas. The theatre department performs two shows per year and is the only school that performs at the Paramount, the local professonal theatre.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

Class of 2015 students must earn a minimum of 24 credits to graduate. Department credit requirements include English 4.0; Fine Arts 2.0; Health & Wellness .5; International Language 3.0; Mathematics 3.0; Science 3.0; Social Studies 4.0; Theology 2.50. International students are not required to take an International Language in addition to English.
