SALISBURY SCHOOL instills in boys a vibrant enthusiasm for learning and the self-confidence needed for intellectual, physical, moral and spiritual development. Built on essential core values, the School's unique culture promotes brotherhood, creativity, empathy, humility, integrity, leadership and respect. Salisbury graduates men of character and promise who are prepared to meet the challenges of college and adulthood and to make a difference in an entrepreneurial, technological and cosmopolitan world.

## THE SCHOOL

Salisbury School is a four-year independent college preparatory school for boys in grades nine through twelve. Founded in 1901, the School enrolls 310 boys; 290 boarders and 20 Approximately $35 \%$ of the student body receives need-based financial aid. There are 98 boys in the Class of 2015.
A recently completed capital campaign raised over $\$ 108,000,000$ for the School. Gifts financed a wide variety of projects and programs including seven endowed scholarships, four teaching fellowships, ten endowed funds, the renovation and restoration of our Main Building, turf field tadium seating, and the creation of a global classroom and video conferencing center

## THE FACULTY

The faculty and administration is comprised of 69 members. Over $60 \%$ of instructors have obtained Masters degrees or higher or are enrolled in a graduate program. The School's seventh headmaster, Chisholm S. Chandler, was appointed in 2003.

- The Entrepreneurial Program is selective and requires students to design a business that benefits the community.
