Central Catholic shows particular regard for students who are educationally at-risk and economically disadvantaged. COMMUNITY

Lawrence is a small urban city located twenty-five miles north of Boston. Known as the "Immigrant City", Lawrence has always been a multi-ethnic and multicultural city. The current population is 71,000. Central Catholic is located in the heart of the city of Lawrence and is committed to the students in this area.

ENROLLMENT and STUDENT BODY

Central Catholic enrolls males and females in grades 9 through 12. Entrance is based upon a competitive examination and demonstration of solid academic performance in grade school. Our current enrollment of 1350+ young men and women reflects a diversified student body representing various ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Students live in over 40 communities in Massachusetts and Southern New Hampshire.

CURRICULUM

A solely college preparatory curriculum divided into four levels: AP – Advanced Placement Courses Honors College Prep Enriched College Prep Standard College Prep

Students take a minimum of 7 academic courses per year. Classes are on a seven day cycle with each course meeting for 65 minutes, 5 out of the 7 days. Grade reports are made on a quarterly basis. Final exams are administered at the end of each semester.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM

Central Catholic has 30+ International Students from China, Korea, Vietnam and Sweden currently enrolled for the academic year 2014-2015.

VIRTUAL HIGH SCHOOL

Central Catholic High School belongs to The Virtual High School Program, allowing 50 students a semester the opportunity to take an online, certified course towards their academic requirements. Students are only allowed to take a course that is not presently offered at Central Catholic. The following courses are offered this year: Creative Writing, Journalism, Number Theory, Astronomy, Genes and Disease, Oceanography, Computer Science, Engineering, Sports and Society, Criminology, Pearl Harbor, Eastern and Western Thought, Latin, Portuguese, Video Design, CAD, International Business, AP Art History, AP Music Theory, Music Critique, History of Photography, AP European History, AP World History, Sociology, AP Computer Science, AP Economics, AP Statistics, Meteorology, Epidemics, DNA Technology. Courses taken through VHS are designated on the transcript with course numbers that begin with 0 –ex: 022: Creative Writing

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Central Catholic is a partner school with Syracuse University offering students the opportunity to receive college credit as they take a course here at school. Presently the two courses offered for dual enrollment for 2013-2014 are: Honors Physics (8 credits) and Honors Forensic Science (4 credits). These courses are designated on the transcript with DE AFTER THE COURSE NAME.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE

"We will give One Day" is a school wide program that entails students giving 24 hours of service to the "least favored". All students must complete this project by April of junior year in order to graduate.

ENRICHMENT CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES

- Summer Reading Program. Students must read three (3) assigned novels, and complete a journal. A grade of Pass or High Pass is given upon meeting requirements. Successful completion is noted on student transcripts with a .25 Enrichment credit.
- Chorus and Band: Students meet three days a week, for 45 minutes previous to the school day. Successful completion earns 1 Credit.

SUMMER TERM

Courses are available for enrichment or remediation. Since all courses must be passed for graduation, failing grades must be addressed in Summer Term. Courses with a grade of "D" may be retaken with a "C+" the maximum possible grade change.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Central Catholic offers AP courses in:

Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, English Language, French Language, Government and Politics, Physics B and C, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Studio Art, US History

Individual Departments determine eligibility for their AP courses; we do not practice open enrollment for AP courses. Sitting for the AP exam is mandatory.

AP offerings have been opened to students in Grades 10 and 11 for those who have accelerated in their course work as well as students who "elect" to take an extra course during the school year.

In May of 2014, 240 students took 504 exams with 87% receiving a score of 3 or better. The Massachusetts average is 70% and the Global average is 59%..
