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## The Mission:

Gould Academy prepares academically motivated students for college and helps them to become independent-minded, ethical citizens who will lead lives of purpose, action, excellence, and compassion in a dynamic world.

## The School \& Community:

A four-year college preparatory boarding school, Gould Academy enrolls 245 students in grades 9 through 12. Located in the picturesque village of Bethel, Maine, ten minutes from Sunday River Ski Resort, Gould students have unparalleled access to Northern New England's diverse natural and cultural resources. Gould's diversity is enriched by students from Austria, Chile, China, Congo, Cyprus, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Netherlands, Rwanda, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, Ukraine, the United Kingdom, and Vietnam. Admission to Gould Academy is selective. Typically, 99\% of the graduating class matriculates at four-year colleges and universities.

Most Gould students advance well beyond these requirements. Independent Study, per approval of the Department Chair and Dean of Academics, is available for credit toward graduation.

## Highest Level Courses by Department:

AP Courses - Beginning in 11th grade, students may gain admission to AP courses by departmental recommendation. Students are generally limited to two or three AP courses per year and are required to sit for the respective exams in May:

## College Preparatory Curriculum:

Gould Academy operates on a trimester system with exams in November and June. Students typically enroll in five or six courses per trimester. It is unusual for a student to carry seven courses in a given trimester.
English students take "Developing a Geographic Imagination" and "Developing a Historic Imagination" before continuing to "Literature of the American Experience" or AP English Language in 11th grade. Seniors may take AP English Literature and/or trimester electives such as "Forgotten Language," "Contemporary Classics," "Creative Writing," and "Banned Books and Films." Non-native speakers of English may also be required to enroll in English Studies classes.
Mathematics courses progress: Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2/Honors, Pre-Calculus/Honors, Calculus/AP, AP Statistics, Honors Senior Math. Seniors who have completed their graduation requirements may elect to take three trimester electives in "Financial Matters."
History students take "Human Geography" and "West and the World" before continuing to US History or AP US History in 11th grade. Seniors may take AP Government and/or trimester electives such as "Global Migrations," "Psychology," "Dylan and American Culture," and "American Myths." Each trimester, History electives focus on particular methodologies: Critical Reading in the fall, Research Methods in the winter, and Presentation in the spring.
Science courses progress: Conceptual Physics, Chemistry/Honors, Biology. Seniors and Juniors may select Physics, trimester electives in Astronomy, Environmental Science, Introduction to Sports Medicine, and Aeronautics, or the AP options listed above.
World Languages include French 1 through 5, Spanish 1 through 5, and Mandarin 1 through 3. Non-native speakers of English are exempt from the World Languages requirement. (Spanish 4 is the only World Languages course that offers an Honors section.)
Visual Arts students may take one year-long course in Ceramics and trimester electives such as Design, Digital Photography, Blacksmithing, Drawing, Filmmaking and Video Production, Painting, Printmaking, and Sculpture.
Performing Arts classes include year-long courses in Band and Chorus, as well as introductory electives in Music Theory, Music Technology, and Music History.
Computer Science offers trimester electives such as Introduction to Computer Science, Topics in Computer Science, Electronics, and Robotics as well as an advanced full-year course in Computer Science.

## Experiential Learning:

Co-Curricular Program: In addition to completing Gould's academic requirements, students are required to participate in athletic, artistic, and/or service programs each trimester.
Four Point Program: At the end of the winter trimester, each Class pursues a challenging week-long assignment, including travel abroad $\left(9^{\text {th }}\right)$, arts and community service $\left(10^{\text {th }}\right)$, outdoor leadership: Winter Expedition $\left(11^{\text {th }}\right)$, and self-designed experiential learning projects $\left(12^{\text {th }}\right)$. These experiential "Four Points" are an integral part of a Gould education and, as such, are a graduation requirement.
