CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Lake Forest Academy's rigorous academic program is designed to meet the various intellectual needs, skills, and maturity of its students. LFA offers advanced level work in the natural sciences, foreign languages, and mathematics, as well as 21 AP courses. Admission to advanced level and AP courses is decided by the appropriate department based on ability and success in previous coursework. LFA also believes in the concept of Independent Study for interested, qualified, and mature students, and it is usually undertaken to move beyond LFA course offerings.

EXPLANATION OF transcript

Psychology is considered a science elective. The French and Spanish Language Culture courses culminate in a service learning trip to a country where students are immersed in the native language. 1/4 credit is awarded to students for completion of a semester-long Independent Study.
