EXETER HIGHLIGHTS 2013-2014

In the spirit of Exeter's school motto 'non sibi, or 'not for self', over 400 Academy employees—faculty, administrators, and staff—volunteered for a full day at three Seacoast sites, where Exeter students who are part of the 700+ member Exeter Social Service Organization (ESSO) volunteer during the academic year.

One '14 senior and '15 upper made Exeter history as the first female president/vice president team leading the school's Student Council.

The Academy's internationally-renowned Math Team continued to earn accolades last year. Four Exeter students were named among the top 12 national winners in the USA Math Olympiad (USAMO) last June. One '13 alumnus and two current '15 and '15 students won individual silver, gold, and bronze medals in July at the International Math Olympiad (IMO) in Colombia.

This year's Lamont Poetry series opens this fall with Michael Collier. Last year's Lamont Poets included U.S. Poet Laureate Natasha Threthewey and Pulitzer Prize nominee Frank Bidart.

The twice-weekly, all-school Assembly program remains a core component of Exeter's weekly schedule. Assembly speakers last year included *New York Times* columnist Nicholas D. Kristof, Harvard economist Greg Mankiw, former New Hampshire governor John Lynch, Buddhism expert Shantam Seth, *Farm City* urban farmer Novella Carpenter, and former Red Sox manager Bobby Valentine.

Athletic teams have continued to earn top regional accolades. Last year, boys' Varsity Basketball and Water Polo won the New England championship; last spring, both boys' and girls' Varsity Spring Track also won New Englands, and the boys' and girls' Varsity Crew teams won the New England Interscholastic Rowing Association (NEIRA), with three boats winning first in their divisions. This fall, the Varsity Cross Country team won the New England Championship for the third year in a row.

This year's Fisher Theatre schedule includes three dance concerts, a fall-term dramatic adaptation of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*, and the winter musical, *Working*.
